3. AWARD CRITERIA

SCI is committed to running a fair and transparent tender process, and ensuring that all bidders are treated and assessed equally during this tender process. Bidder responses will be evaluated against four weighted categories of criteria: Essential Criteria, Sustainability Criteria, Capability Criteria, and Commercial Criteria.

3.1 ESSENTIAL CRITERIA

Criteria, which bidders **must** meet in order to progress to the next round of evaluation. If a bidder does not meet any of the Essential Criteria, they will be excluded from the tender process immediately. These criteria are scored as 'Pass' / 'Fail'.

3.2 SUSTAINABILITY CRITERIA (10%)

Criteria used to evaluate the impact a supplier has on the environment, local economy and community. Bids will be evaluated against the same pre-agreed Criteria.

3.3 CAPABILITY CRITERIA (30%)

Criteria that will used to evaluate the bidders' ability, skill and experience in relation to the requirements of SCI. All bids will be evaluated against the same pre-agreed Capability Criteria

3.4 QUALITY CRITERIA (30%)

These are criteria that will used to evaluate the bidders' quality assurance system and experience in relation to the requirements of SCI. All bids which pass the Essential Criteria will be evaluated against the same pre-agreed Quality Criteria, which will have been created by a committee of representatives from SCI..

3.5 COMMERIAL CRITERIA (30%)

Criteria used to evaluate the commercial competitiveness of a bid. Bids will be evaluated against the same pre-agreed Criteria.



4. GOOD MANUFACTURING /GOOD DISTRIBUTION PRACTICE SITE VISIT

Following the technical evaluation of the Award criteria as described in section 3 above, the SCI office will conduct either a Good Manufacturing or Good Distribution Practice (GDP) Site Visit for those suppliers that have been shortlisted as potential suppliers that SCI wishes to engage a long-term arrangement with.

The purpose of this site visit checklist is to carry out a physical check in order to evaluate suppliers against internationally recognized Quality Assurance standards.

5. **VETTING**

Successful bidders must be successfully vetted. This involves checking bidders and key personnel against Global Watch Lists, Enhanced Due Diligence Lists and Politically Exposed Persons Lists. The vetting of bidders will be completed after the award decision and prior to any contract being signed, or orders placed. If any information provided by the Bidder throughout the tender process is proved to be incorrect during the vetting process (or at any other point), SCI may withdraw their award decision.
