Capacity building and small grant support for local CSOs/CBOs

What is the objective of the project?

The project aims to strengthen the capacities of Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) and Community-Based Organizations (CBOs) to support households affected by the earthquake, in particular Persons with Disabilities, to restore their livelihoods, guarantee their basic rights, and reduce risks that may affect their protection.

What activities does the project include?



1. Capacity-Building Training.



3. Cash Grants for the selected proposals.



2. Proposal Writing Mentorship.



4. Peer-to-Peer Exchanges.



5. Implementation and Follow-up Support.

What are the criteria?

- Legal registration.
- Have an active office in Hatay.
- Worked with Earthquake survivors.
- Annual budget for 2023 is less than 500,000\$.
- Experience in one of the following areas: protection, education, health, agriculture, support for people with disabilities, economic recovery, children, women or youth services.

How much is the financial grant?

Maximum 20,000 euros

Selected organizations can receive a grant of up to 20,000 euros, after they pass the committee selection and after review and scoring of their proposals. The grant cannot be used to repay debts, purchase new facilities, land or vehicles ect. Note: not all the organizations will receive the same grant amount.

Note1: Target group priorities: children with protection risks, GBV, PwDs, youth support and localization and refugees.

Note2: Attendance of 80% of the capacity building training is mandatory to be eligible to apply for grant support.
